- Nicole read a few thank you notes for the staff Thanksgiving and Christmas gifts. She thanked Val Crouch and Whitney Tribulak for their creativity and hard work.
- Nicole asked for volunteers to help with Teacher Appreciation Week February 10-14.

Hawk Heroes Breakfast:

- The Hawk Heroes Breakfast will be held on Friday, January 31st. This event is designed to welcome dads and other influential father-figures to WCA.

BINGO:

- There was some discussion of how to handle fundraising incentives. The decision was tabled for the February PTF meeting.
